Our Empower Me sessions have been running now for just over 18 months, all supported by our volunteers and external supporters, and what a year it has been! Women's Centre Update - By Jo Bigger, Service Manager

The Women's Centre remains busy with referrals continuing to come in from practitioners and also women self referring. We are now able to restart our Child Contact advice sessions for women being controlled by their perpetrator via the children, this is vital to give women an opportunity to discuss issues around child contact and the impact it is having on them and their children. These sessions are only offered to women who have had an advice appointment so that the risk has been ascertained first to ensure their safety.

Currently we are running 5 Freedom Programmes and 4 Power To Change programmes for women, which are a mix of face to face and online, as well as 4 Escape the Trap courses for teenagers. There continues to be numerous group and 1-2-1 sessions for children that are all face to face as they are very activity based. However we do have a

long waiting list for these courses, and funding is essential to keep this service going forward.

Our Community Worker and other local organisations, have organised a Cultural Community Day on Friday 16th August, this will be held in Christchurch Park, there will be a number of agencies attending, offering advice and support, games for children and attendees are encouraged to bring along a picnic for a fabulous and inclusive community day.

Refuge Update - By Jo Bigger, Service Manager

At the time of writing our Refuge is at 90% capacity and has continued to be so for some time, there will always be small drops now and then, when women move out and we await a new referral and arrival of the next woman and her children. This is a busy time for our Housekeeper who will clear a room when a family or women has moved out and prepare the room ready for new arrivals. Once she knows who will be coming and when, she will give the room another good clean, make up the beds, add a basket of toiletries and age appropriate toys if needed and stock the fridge and cupboard with food. This is an area where our fundraising is invaluable and we really couldn't offer the support we do without it.

National Grid kindly came and cleared an area of the garden to allow our Children's Support Workers to set up a Magic Forest Club. This area will be used on a weekly basis to allow lots of fun activities to take place,

these will include bug hunting and identification, foraging, whittling wood to make marshmallow sticks, as well as completing flora and fauna identification sheets. Being out in nature is a proven benefit for our wellbeing so it is a wonderful addition for our refuge families.

We have had a busy few months since our last newsletter went out at the end of January, with the pleasure of attending a number of events and cheque presentations, giving talks to community groups and businesses, as well as greeting supporters at our Women's Centre when they kindly drop off physical donations to support our work.

The support we receive from our local community plays a fundamental role in the support we can provide to those who turn to Lighthouse in their time of need. Our clients are always very thankful for this support and knowing that there are people and organisations out there willing to help them, also instils a sense that they are believed and this was not their fault.

Now more than ever Lighthouse needs your help, with statutory funding, trusts and foundations having ever increasing requests for support, the odds of receiving funding once an application is submitted is getting smaller, one foundation recently received 490 applications for funding but only had the ability to support 20, and sadly Lighthouse were not in the 20 to receive support.

Our Women's Centre supports over 1,000 women and their children each year from across Suffolk, and is reliant on fundraising donations, so the donations you provide both monetary and physical make such a difference to their lives and in some cases saves their lives. So by rallying together and channelling the power of many, we know our community can achieve remarkable feats and ensure that Lighthouse continues to be there for those in desperate need.
