Welcome to our Newsletter. This newsletter keeps you in touch with the work of the Parish council as it is vital that everyone in the community feels involved and connected. There are contact details at the need of this letter if you need to ask anything at all.

Highways Working Group November 2022.

We know that traffic through the high street remains a huge concern for many and the parish survey was a great success in highlighting the issues.

We can report some positive progress. With the support of our County and District Councillors, Mathew Hicks and Tim Passmore, we were able to meet with Suffolk County Highways, SCC Trading Standards (Lorry watch) and SCC Cabinet Member for Transport, Richard Smith, on 17 the October.

We discussed lorry movements in the High Street and vehicle speeds throughout the parish. We commented that people had stopped reporting over-weight lorries as no action being taken. In addition, reporting HGV's on SCC website goes to SCC Transport and there is no link to Trading Standards. SCC is to look into reports to SCCT transport linking with Trading Standards.

Suffolk Police have created a commercial vehicle unit which will aid enforcement.

Tim Passmore is now in discussions with the Suffolk Police to install an Auto Number Plate Recognition (APNR) camera in the High Street.

Defibrillator

The "eagle eyed" cannot have failed to notice that Coddenham now has a second defibrillator. Funded by the Gardemau Trust, Day Foundation, Parish Council, Roy Gudgin and County Councillor Matthew Hicks's Locality budget, this has been installed on the outside of the Community Shop. We are also grateful to the Community Shop for providing the power source.

There is also a defibrillator outside Haysel House.

In emergency both can be accessed via the 999 service.

Community Litter Pick

Working with The Coddenham Centre, the Parish Council has held 2 Community Litter Picks this year. In June we "Cleaned for the Queen" and we also collected litter in September.

We are fortunate that within the village there is a relatively small amount of litter left. However, the quantity of litter thrown from cars and "fly tipping" on the B1078 within Coddenham Parish is shocking.

In September 14 sacks of litter and various bits that had dropped off vehicles were collected from the verges of the B1078, from the bridge to the A140 alone. This is over three times more that the total collected from the village itself.

Important information -Broom Hill and Mill Hill



The Parish Council owns four parcels of land in the village on Broom Hill, on Mill Hill, at Three Cocked Hat and the allotments. When Broom Hill was purchased in the late 1980's, it was placed in a charitable trust by the then parish councillors to preserve and enhance Broom Hill for the public benefit of Coddenham residents.

Councillors Groom, Soanes and Stanley-Bell have recently become the Co-operative Trustees and responsible for day to day management of Broom Hill under those trust arrangements.

It is the intention of the Parish Council to place Mill Hill in a similar trust to likewise preserve and enhance Mill Hill for the public benefit of Coddenham inhabitants etc.

The Parish Council has also applied to the Land Registry for voluntary registration of title to the land on Broom Hill and at Three Cocked Hat, as these pieces of land were acquired in the 1980s before registration was required or possible, so that details of the Parish Council's ownership is transparent and to protect against possible fraud.

This had previously been shared as an idea with other Parish organisations and residents via the e-mail cascade and on Facebook, with only messages of support received.

Warm Homes Initiative

From late February into March next year a Thermal Imaging Camera is being made available by Suffolk County Council, which will enable us to work with householders to identify those which might be able to avail themselves of Warm Homes grants and/or advice to reduce their carbon footprint and their energy bills, through the Warm Homes initiative or through the Energy Saving Trust.
